Detailed Itinerary:

Day 1: Tarangire National Park

Your Wild Frontiers safari guide will collect you early this morning from your Arusha hotel. Head away from the main safari route of the northern circuit, to Tarangire National Park, a true hidden gem. (Driving time 90 mins - 2 hours). Enjoy a game drive with picnic lunch.

From Tarangire, head up through the beautiful highlands to the farm rich area of Karatu on the outer slopes of Ngorongoro crater. (Driving time via Manyara +- 1 hour)

Overnight: Bougainvillea Safari Lodge

Located on the outskirts of the town of Karatu in Tanzania, Bougainvillea Safari Lodge is an excellent option for a countryside getaway. Accommodation features comfortably furnished cottages. Beat the African heat with a dip in the refreshing swimming pool.

Day 2: Ngorongoro Crater – Serengeti

Incredible and unforgettable, today is surely one you've been itching to tick off your African travel bucket list.

One of the natural wonders of the world, the volcanic caldera of Ngorongoro offers spectacular game viewing in the crater. We can almost guarantee you four of the Big Five will show up, as well as a rich variety of birds, all viewed against the backdrop of the thickly forested crater walls.

Varied terrains and dramatic landscapes consisting of forest, grasslands and both freshwater and soda lakes make the Ngorongoro Crater a true marvel of creation.



Continue into the heart of the Serengeti, to a pristine area located to the east of the famous central Seronera region, and offering unparalleled game viewing.

Here lies Serengeti Wilderness Camp, a great place to base up all year round. There is exceptional resident game in the area, including the big cats, herds of elephant, wildbeest, zebra, buffalo and plenty of antelope. At certain times of the year migration is a stone's throw from the camp. Enjoy game drives in this area.

Days at leisure to enjoy games drives in the Serengeti. How about an optional balloon safari - a fantastic way to experience a bird's eye view of the vast plains.

Overnight: Serengeti Wilderness Camp

Day 6: Karatu

Head back toward Ngorongoro region.

Overnight: Bougainvillea Safari Lodge

Day 7: Lake Manyara

Return via Lake Manyara to Arusha. Enjoy a game drive in Lake Manyara National Park.

Lake Manyara National Park is famous for its tree-climbing lions, who spend most of the day spread out along the branches of Acacia trees six to seven metres above the ground. Nestled at the base of the Great Rift Valley escarpment, the park is noted for its incredible beauty. As visitors enter the gate, they pass into the lush forest, home to troops of baboons and both blue and vervet monkeys. Further along, the forest opens up into woodlands, grassland, swamps and beyond the soda lake itself, covering 200 square kilometres and sanctuary to over 400 species of bird including flamingo, pelican, stork, sacred ibis, cormorant and Egyptian Geese. The park is particularly noted for its huge herds of buffalo and elephant, as well as giraffe, hippo, reedbuck, warthog, wildebeest, zebra and a great variety of smaller animals.

GENERAL INFO:

Visa requirements:

All visitors to Tanzania must have a valid passport which needs to be valid for 6 months after return date of travel and have at least 3 blank pages in it. Except for exempted countries all visitors require a visa to enter Tanzania. South Africans visiting on holiday currently do not require a visa. Visas are currently US\$ 50 per person, single entry for most other nationalities.

We recommend that all visitors to Tanzania apply via the e-visa portal:

<https://eservices.immigration.go.tz/visa>. The online process asks for more information than a visa on arrival, and visas are issued within 2 - 3 weeks.

Health requirements

Currently the situation is that officially, yellow fever vaccines are no longer required to enter Tanzania unless you have been via an endemic area. However, on the ground, it often differs and you are **likely to be ASKED FOR YELLOW FEVER** certificate, even if you have only been in transit via Nairobi. We strongly suggest you have a Yellow Fever vaccination in any case, as regulations can change and often staff at border posts have the incorrect information on this, which can cause delays.

The Migration explained: The following should be used as a guideline when planning your safari to East Africa – movement of wildlife depends on a great many aspects. The following migration calendar helps to explain the seasonality of game viewing. Remember there is resident game throughout the year in the Serengeti/Ngorongoro eco-systems.

JAN / FEB / MARCH

The large herds of wildebeest are generally in the southern plains of the Serengeti eco-system, calving takes place over approximately two weeks. An abundance of predators, good visibility of game, mix of open plains and some woodland.

APRIL / MAY

The herds start moving toward central Serengeti. This is typically the rainy season, however, game viewing is still excellent and there are some great discounts available at lodges and camps. It generally doesn't rain all day. Conditions for photography are generally superb with moody skies and good depth of colour.

JUNE / JULY / AUGUST

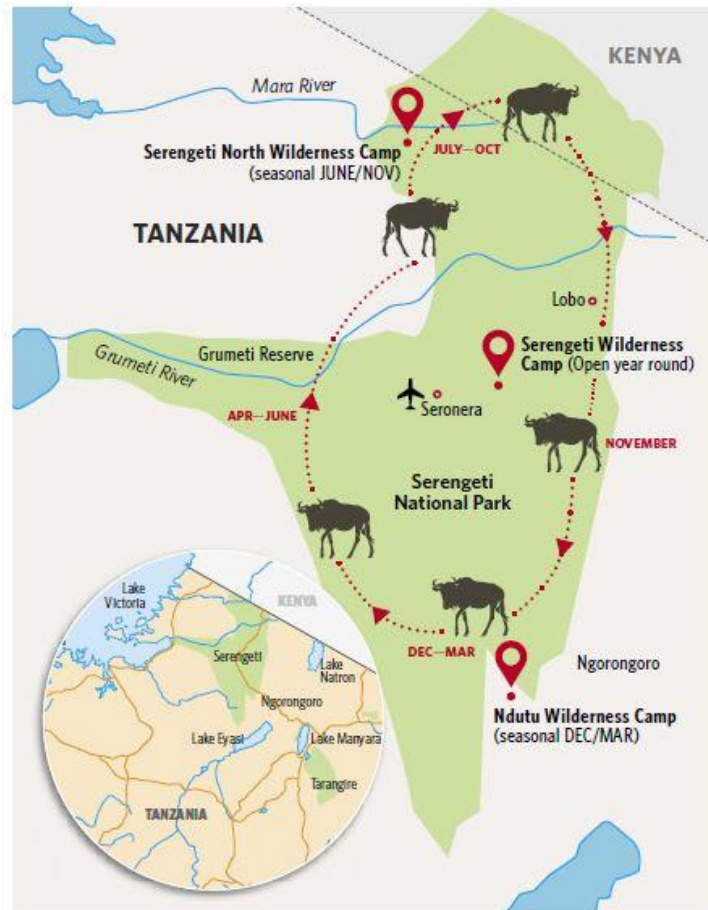
The wildebeest move from the central area and split to the west and north, continuing their trek toward the Mara River. River crossings may be seen in both the western corridor (Grumeti area) and north (Mara River) within the Serengeti.

SEPTEMBER / OCTOBER

Whilst some of the wildebeest successfully reach the Masai Mara, there are still hundreds of thousands remaining in the northern region of Serengeti, offering those with guests with loads of patience the chance to see exciting river crossings (the Mara River runs through the Serengeti).

NOVEMBER / DECEMBER

The massive herds start to return from the north, to the southern plains, before the cycle repeats again!
