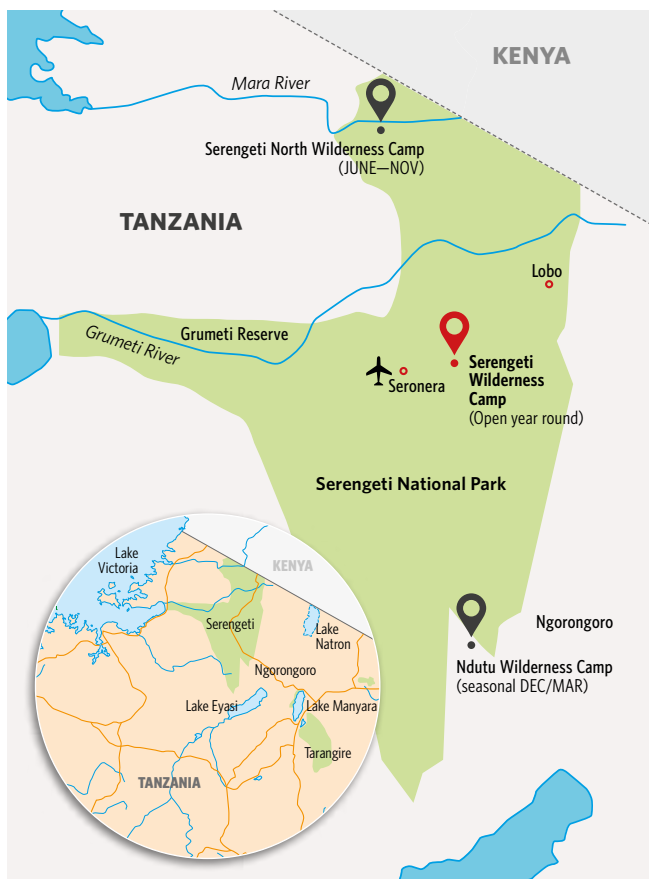
Welcome to Serengeti Wilderness Camp

Located in the heart of the Serengeti, in a pristine area that offers unparalleled game viewing, Serengeti Wilderness Camp is open all year round, and is located to the east of the famous central Seronera region.

Comprising just twelve spacious tents, including a family tent, our focus is on your comfort and enjoyment. There is nothing better than being lulled to sleep at night by the sounds of the bush, safely inside your well-appointed 'safari bedroom'. The tents are en suite with flushing toilets and a bush-shower. A private verandah offers a shady place to relax.

A large central dining tent complements our comfortable lounge tent which has a small reference library, maps, some games for children, a charging station for cameras and WiFi.

Our safari chef will prepare sumptuous meals for your enjoyment and evenings offer a campfire around which our guests enjoy sundowners and snacks, and share the day's experiences.



If you prefer an intimate safari experience, without compromising on comfort, our Wilderness Camps offer just that. This camp is small, offering traditional 'under canvas' accommodation with superb food, a relaxing atmosphere and great Tanzanian hospitality in one of the most beautiful places on earth!

About the area

Seronera's network of river valleys ensure year-round water supplies and support an incredibly rich wildlife population throughout the year. There is plenty of resident game: big cats, elephant and buffalo herds - and of course it's in the path of the wildebeest migration - an incredible spectacle.

Your safari experience

We offer game drives throughout the Serengeti in our specially modified safari vehicles, and also offer multi-day guided walking safaris from our camp by prior arrangement. These are conducted with our professional guides and a parks ranger and must be pre-booked in conjunction with a Wild Frontiers' safari.

Other activities in the area include

- » **Birding:** very rewarding, both around the camp and on game drives
- » **Balloon safari:** enjoy a bird's eye view as you gently float above the majestic Serengeti plains

Other safari highlights in the region include Ngorongoro Crater, Olduvai Gorge, Ol Donyo Lengai active volcano and Lake Natron.

When to go

The camp is open all year round, with abundant resident game. At certain times of the year, the camp is right in the path of the wildebeest migration.

JANUARY TO MARCH

Wildebeest in southern Serengeti plains where the calving takes place. Open grasslands, great visibility, and plenty of predator interaction.

APRIL TO MAY

Rainy season, fantastic photographic opportunities, dramatic skies and clear visibility. Perfect if you don't want to go at a busy time. Green/low season rates available.

JUNE TO JULY

Migration continues moving central/west and northwards.

AUGUST TO OCTOBER

Excellent game viewing during the drier months, particularly around the west and northern areas, along the Mara and Grumeti Rivers.

NOVEMBER TO DECEMBER

The return of the wildebeest through the central to the southern plains of the Serengeti to begin the whole process again.

- » Fly from Kilimanjaro/Arusha to Seronera airstrip; about a 20-minute drive from camp
