Day 1: Tamarind Tree Hotel, Nairobi

You will be met on arrival at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport and transferred to Tamarind Tree Hotel.

Situated along the Nairobi River in beautiful Kenya, the capital of **Nairobi** is East Africa's most cosmopolitan city and serves as an excellent starting point for African safari trips around Kenya. It's Africa's 4th largest city and is a vibrant and exciting place to be. There are some fascinating attractions: its cafe culture, unbridled nightlife, the National Museum, the Karen Blixen Museum and most notably, just 20 minutes from the city centre, wild lions and buffalo roam in the world's only urban game reserve. Make sure you pay a visit to the elephant orphanage operated by the David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust for a once in a lifetime experience.

Overnight: Tamarind Tree Hotel

Tamarind Tree Hotel is ideally located just 5 km to the southwest of Nairobi within the spacious Carnivore grounds and it's iconic Carnivore Restaurant. The nearby Langata and Karen suburbs are among the liveliest and most popular in Nairobi with world-class shopping malls and excellent restaurants. The hotel offers outstanding leisure facilities and genuine service that ensure all guests experience the very best of Tamarind hospitality.



Day 2-5: Basecamp Masai Mara, Masai Mara

After breakfast, transfer to Wilson Airport and depart on the morning schedule flight at 10h00. Check in is 1 hour before departure. Arrive Mara at 11h00 and transfer for check in, followed by lunch and an afternoon game drive.

The **Masai Mara** together with Tanzania's Serengeti form Africa's most famous wildlife park, the Masai Mara National Reserve. The image of acacia trees dotting endless grass plains epitomises Africa for many, then add a Maasai warrior and some cattle to the picture and the conversation need go no further. The highlight here is undoubtedly the annual wildebeest migration traversing the vast plains of the Serengeti and the Masai Mara. It is known as the largest mass movement of land mammals on the planet – with more than a million animals following the rains. Large prides of lions, herds of elephants, as well as giraffes, gazelles and eland can also be spotted in the reserve.

Overnight: Basecamp Masai Mara x 3 nights [View iBrochure](#)

Enjoy morning and afternoon game drives while in the Masai Mara Reserve (in shared open sided game drive vehicles), as well as a visit to local community projects.

Basecamp Masai Mara offers 17 spacious and luxurious Riverside Tents. The tents are built along the banks of the Talek River, the natural border to the Masai Mara National Reserve. The dense riverbed foliage allows for maximum privacy and comfort, without compromising the view of the Masai Mara National Reserve just a stone throw away. With more than 300 identified bird species, you are certain to wake to a symphony of birdsong while staying at Basecamp Masai Mara.

Next to Basecamp Masai Mara is the Enjoolata Awareness Centre where guests are invited into exhibitions, movies, photo editing and face-to-face meetings with the Maasais providing a deeper understanding to anyone who seeks knowledge about this fascinating culture and place.



Day 5: Flamingo Hill Tented Camp, Nakuru

Early pre breakfast game drive. Transfer to the Mara airstrip and depart on the schedule flight at 11h00. Arrive Wilson Airport at 12h15 where you will be met by your safari guide. Depart with picnic lunches for Lake Nakuru. Game drive enroute.

Transport from days 5 - 8 will be in a private Landcruiser with open roof hatch for game viewing.

Lake Nakuru National Park, surrounding Nakuru, is home to exceptional birdlife, as well as over 50 varieties of mammals including lion, leopard, buffalo, zebra, giraffe, rhino, antelope and various primates. History and culture enthusiasts should make sure to visit the incredible Hyrax Hill prehistoric site.

Overnight: Flamingo Hill Tented Camp

Flamingo Hill Camp is situated within the famous Lake Nakuru National Park, which lies within the Great Rift Valley of Kenya. Nestled between the “honeymoon hills” and set in beautifully landscaped grounds with natural foliage and a variety of indigenous African plants and flowers, Flamingo Hill Camp provides superb, tented accommodation.

It is an eco-friendly establishment, with income from the camp used for environmental restoration and protection of endangered species.

Cosy, warm and inviting with a personal touch, Flamingo Hill Camp offers the traveller a home away from home.



Day 6-8: Kibo Safari Camp, Amboseli National Park

Early morning departure and drive to Amboseli. Picnic lunches and game drive enroute.

Located in the southern reaches of Kenya, the Amboseli National Park is renowned for its excellent variety of wildlife such as Maasai giraffe, elephant, lion and cheetah and not surprisingly it is one of Kenya's most popular parks. The landscape of Amboseli is dominated by the majestic Mount Kilimanjaro, as well as open plains, acacia woodland, swamps and the massif of Ol Doinyo Orok. The birding is excellent, especially closer to the lakes and swamps. The park is famous for being the best place in Africa to get close to large herds of elephants among other wildlife species.

Overnight: Kibo Safari Camp x 2 nights

Kibo Safari Camp is a luxury tented camp set within Amboseli National Park at the foot of Mount Kilimanjaro. Dine under Acacia trees in the open terraced restaurant overlooking Africa's highest peak, where meals feature fresh fruit and veggies picked from the camp's own farm. Drinks are served under canvas at the large stone and wood bar, or order to your chair in the roomy lounge.

The 73 guest tents feature custom designed locally built beds made using bush logs and promise a good night's sleep. Guests can enjoy free WiFi. Leisure activities include swimming pool, gift shop, art gallery and a spa where guests can relax and unwind.

Enjoy morning and afternoon game drives during your stay here.



Day 8: Tamarind Tree Hotel, Nairobi

Depart after breakfast and drive back to Nairobi. Arrive in the afternoon and drop off at Tamarind Tree Hotel for your overnight stay.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

A Yellow Fever inoculation is compulsory. Should you require one, this must be done no later than 10 days prior to your departure. Tetanus inoculation is also recommended.

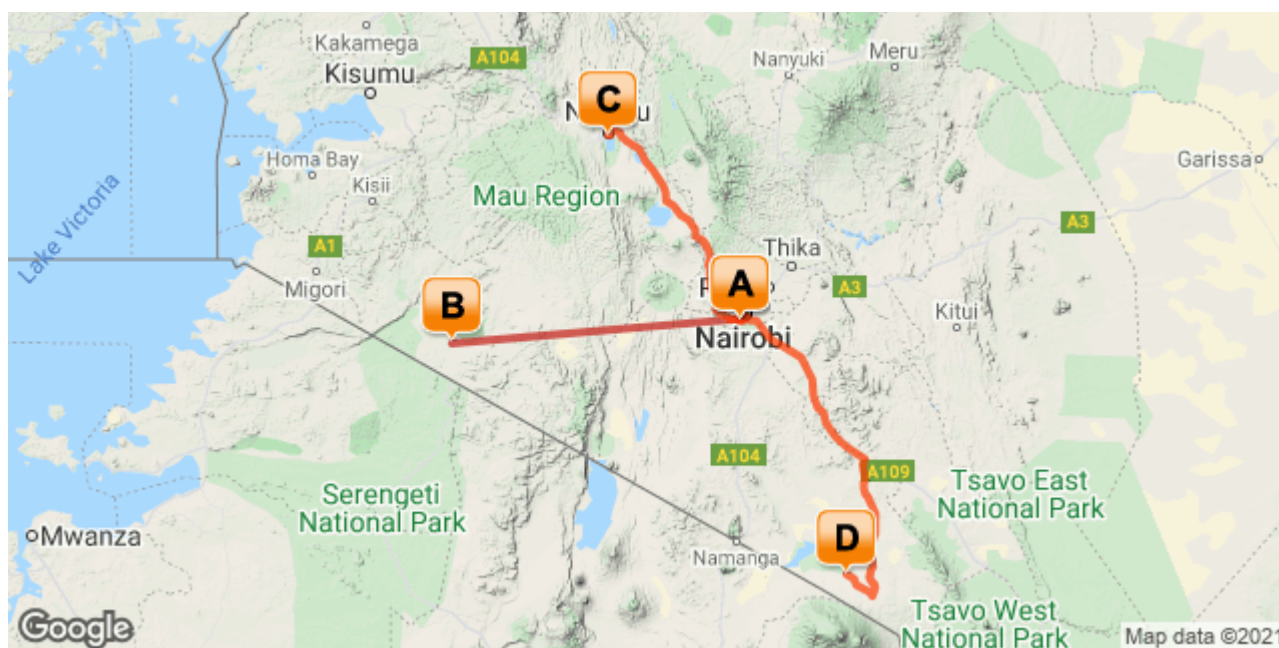

Malaria prophylactics are recommended as malaria is endemic to most of Kenya.

PASSPORT AND VISAS

All visitors to Kenya must be in possession of a valid passport, which must be valid for 6 months after return date of travel and have at least 3 blank pages in it.

From January 2024 the Kenyan Government removed all visa requirements for all foreign nationals visiting and transiting through Kenya. The vacated visa requirements have been replaced by the Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) system at a cost of \$30. Successful applicants will be issued their approved ETA in 3 days, but travellers are encouraged to process their ETA 3 months in advance, it will be valid for 90 days and is applicable to 1 visit to Kenya. Any visitor to Kenya must have their ETA approved before their journey starts. To apply for the ETA visit <https://www.etakenya.go.ke/en>.
